## Development of Capacities of the egressed students from the MBA Administration in Health of the Vision Institute Manuel Meireles

Objective: To investigate if there is lineal and positive correlation between MBA Administration excellence in Health of the Vision Institute and the development of capacities of the egressed students. Methods: The present research can be characterized as a field study, accomplished through the survey technique. It is also a research of descriptive nature. The research was accomplished through applied questionnaires to former students of the MBA Administration in Health with n=30. The analysis of the collected data was made through parametric and non-parametric methods: r of Pearson and Q of Yule; tests t of Student, of the sum of series, of the medium and Test U of Mann-Whitney. Results: The variables considered in the test of this hypothesis were MBA Administration excellence in Health, of the Vision Institute that obtained an approval of 98,33% and the development of capacities of the egressed students. The results show that the veterans present significant development of capacities, with approval ≥ 95,00%, especially the following: (1) capacity to commit with the objectives of the organization: (2) domain of new technical knowledge associated with the exercise of position or busy function; (3) capacity of interpersonal relationship; (4) action initiative and decision; and (5) enterprising capacity. The correlation between MBA Administration excellence in Health and the development of capacities for the egressed students, according to the nonparametric test of Spearman, is significant to the level a=0,01. There is a significant correlation between these two variables, by r of Pearson = 0.782 with p-value = 0,000. Conclusion: The hypothesis that there is lineal and positive correlation between MBA Administration excellence in Health and the development of capacities of the egressed students is not rejected.
